How to help



Avoid stepping Do not feed on coral and seagrass - step marine only on sand animals



Don't touch or fish or other take endangered species like sea and sand on turtles



Leave seashells the beach



Pick up your trash - don't leave it on the beach

Sea Safety



Be careful before entering the water and look for warning flags on the lifeguard towers. Do not swim if the red flag is up.



Swim in



If you are caught in a strong current, do not panic and do not swim against the current. Swim parallel to the shore, then swim back to shore once you are out of the current.



Use a flotation device

Fishing Rules



Guam has five marine preserves, which are areas where fishing is restricted

For all marine preserves, it is illegal to:

- Spearfish
- Take sea cucumbers, crabs, snails, coral (alive or dead), sand, shells, rocks, seagrass, mangroves, or other natural materials

Specific fishing rules for each marine preserve

Tumon Bau

From shore - only hook and line or talaya (cast net) may be used to catch:













From the reef edge: only talaya (cast net) may be used to catch:



Convict tang (Kichu)



Piti Bomb Holes

Fishing is ONLY allowed by permit for certain species. Call the TOKA phone number to see if permits are in effect: (671)-864-8652

Sasa Bay

NO fishing is allowed.

Achang Reef Flat

Fishing is ONLY allowed by permit for certain species. Call the TOKA phone number to see if permits are in effect:

(671) - 864-8652

Pati Point

Hook and line fishing is ONLY allowed from shore.



Illegal Island-wide

- Spearfishing while SCUBA diving.
- Destroying coral to clear the fishing area.
- Fishing using explosives, poison, or electric shocking devices.
- Using a gill net longer than 1000 ft, using a gill net for commercial harvest, or leaving it in the water for over 6 hours.
